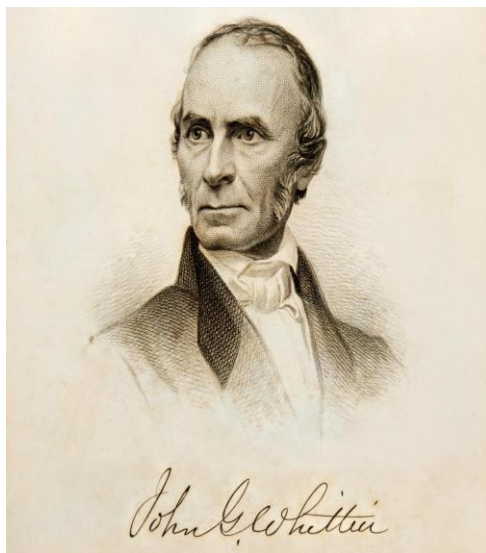

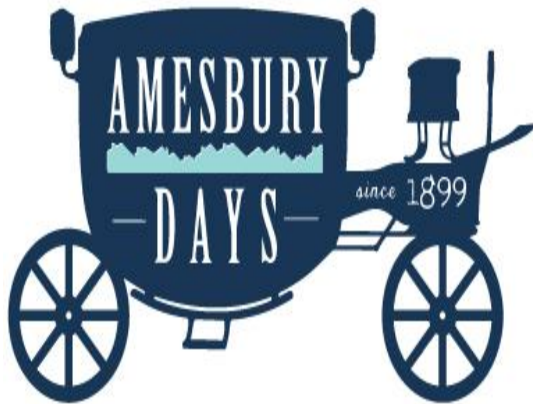
Mrs. Eddy and John Greenleaf Whittier

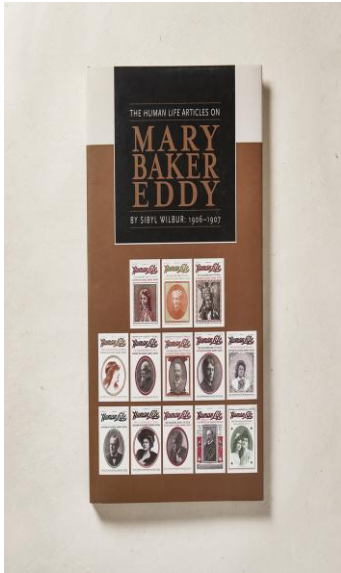
