Wednesday Prayer and Share Topic:

“Finding Comfort”

In the “Message for ’02,” Mary Baker Eddy writes: *To the burdened and weary, Jesus saith: “Come unto me.” O glorious hope! there remaineth a rest for the righteous, a rest in Christ, a peace in Love. The thought of it stills complaint; the heaving surf of life’s troubled sea foams itself away, and underneath is a deep-settled calm.*

Eddy’s language – rhythmic and rich in metaphor – is poetic, a complement to the Bible’s lyrical passages. No wonder people have turned to scriptural writings seeking to regain a sense of peace in turbulent times. Both the Bible and Eddy’s writings offer reassurance by providing a vision of reality governed not by chaos or loss, but by divine order, intelligence and love.

Questions to consider:

- What passages in scriptural or other writings bring you comfort or create a deeper context for events as they play out on the material scene?
- Have scriptural words of comfort helped you achieve a “deep-settled calm,” or what might be called a spiritual awakening to what has always been true?
- How can insights from the Bible or Eddy’s writings shape the way you respond to fear, anxiety, or uncertainty?
- Do you have any healing experiences or inspiration to share?

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
